Green Flag Success

Cloughoge Primary School in Newry has been awarded a prestigious Eco-Schools Green Flag by the environmental charity TIDY Northern Ireland.

The Eco-Schools Programme is the world's largest Environmental Education programme and aims to make environmental awareness and action an intrinsic part of the life and ethos of a school. In Northern Ireland, Eco-Schools is sponsored by Airtricity and its participatory approach and combination of learning and action makes it an ideal way for schools to begin improving the environments of schools and their local communities.

Eco-Schools work through a simple seven-step approach resulting in the programme becoming central to the school's ethos. Schools can choose from ten eco-topics ranging from litter and waste, to energy, biodiversity and transport to name a few. Eco-Schools work towards achieving awards - bronze, silver and the prestigious green flag.

The students in Cloughoge Primary School have worked on a number of these topics over the last few years to reach their green flag status. The staff and pupils have saved energy by employing an effective traffic light system for switching off lights and data projectors when not needed. They also compost food waste and have used this when planting flowers, trees, fruit and vegetable patches. The biodiversity of the school has been improved with the creation of two insect hotels, bat boxes, bird feeders and hogtats for hedgehogs. A number of colourful murals have been created to enhance the appearance of the school grounds and the children have been diligently campaigning to eliminate dog fouling in the vicinity of the school. The student council meet at least once a month to discuss these topics and organise projects, competitions, assembly presentations, rotas and newsletters to keep all pupils and parents informed.

After being externally assessed Cloughoge Primary School has been awarded the highest award, the internationally recognised Green Flag which symbolises excellence in the field of environmental activity. The school would like to thank all the staff, pupils and parents for their dedication to the Eco-Schools projects and continued success as they strive to make a difference.



Cloughoge Walking Bus

For Walk to School Week, on 19th May the school decided to organize a Walking Bus which started at the Spar car park opposite Cloughoge Chapel and ended at the school. Pupils were accompanied by school teachers and classroom assistants. All the children who took part were supplied with high visibility jacket. The pupils thought the Walking Bus was a good idea because it minimizes traffic congestion around school premise and boosts concentration levels. All those who took part enjoyed the early morning stroll as they got fresh air, and talked to their friends as well as developing their road safety skills. 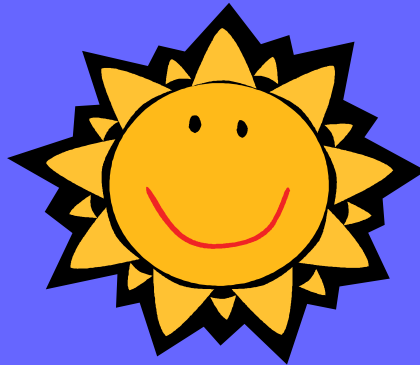
We would like to express our gratitude for her hard work and care. We will miss her.
